# Philippines, Leyte Gulf—Part 2

Two brilliant Admirals at Leyte Gulf began to develop a strategy to prevent the Japanese from challenging our forces within the gulf. So with two escort carriers, a few old battleships, a few cruisers and seven or eight tin cans, the plan took shape. (Remember, our three main fleets were not in this area; they were several days away, and that would be too late to assist the gulf fleet and save the Leyte operation.) So Admiral Fechteler ordered all non-warships to prepare to weigh anchor, but be prepared to set sail at a moment's notice. At the same time, Admiral Oldendorf took his entire group of warships and spread them across the end of Saragao strait. In other words they would "Cross the **T**." This meant that our warships were to be spread across (not stopped or anchored) the entire eastern most end of the Saragao strait which was at Leyte's southeastern entrance. That was immediately put into operation as a moveable

blockade.

As soon as the enemy forces came within range, our warships initiated a barrage of high explosive shells, aircraft bombs and sustained strafing by our pilots. The battle raged for several hours with tremendous explosions lighting up the night. Neither side could claim victory yet.

Our cargo was still being unloaded as rapidly as possible, especially the belly tanks and bombs for our aircraft. It didn't take long for our pilots to drop all available bombs, so they improvised. After dropping their bombs, they flew back to Tacloban airstrip and loaded their planes with belly tanks full of aircraft fuel and returned to the combat area. When these belly tanks were dropped onto enemy ships, they exploded, with the volatile fuel causing many fires. Both sides experienced heavy damage, but finally the

'Japs' retreated into the night.

Admirals Oldendorf and Fechteler discussed the enemy's retreat, trying to determine whether or not to follow the enemy for an hour or so, just to be sure their retreat was not another cunning ac-

tion to lure our forces away from Leyte. Our admirals considered the enemy could very easily retreat around the northern tip of Negros Island and return into the Saragao strait. And if we followed their retreat. we would be somewhere in the Philippines,

away from Leyte. They could easily attack our forces on Leyte beaches, and destroy everything we had already achieved.

After a short pursuit, our battle forces and carriers all returned to our original positions and "crossed the **T**" again. Fortunately, our Admirals were exactly right. In just a few days, the Japanese fleet returned to the strait and was totally defeated. This time, they did not return to this area.

About six weeks later I returned to duty as a signalman in Adm. Fechteler's staff. I was assigned to "light duty" in the flag plot on the bridge until I regained strength in my leg. Every officer in the flag plot had 'scrambled eggs' on his hat (the leaf-shaped embellishments on the visors of a senior naval officer's cap). Those were the officers who made the "big" decisions.

There were three enlisted men in the compartment; the Admiral's chef, his

whale boat operator and a signalman (me). Each of us was at the Admiral's disposal 24 hours a day. We were all under strict orders to never mention anything that was discussed or enacted in the flag plot. To violate this confidence would be a courts-martial offense.


During my several weeks of recovery and

working in the flag plot, my knowledge of many wartime events became very clear to me. That is where I learned more about the "Buna Graveyard." I also learned about so many people who were part of the war effort: Navy, Seabees, Marines. Army.

Pilots, Coast Guard, Merchant Marine, Frogmen, National Guard, hospital ships, service doctors and nurses, pharmacist mates, medics, service and civilian spotters, natives who aided us on many islands, factory workers at home, all others who sacrificed so much so that our servicemen and women could achieve their objectives. And I will always feel gratitude to all those who lost their lives fighting for our country.

One of the most important naval battles of the pacific in WWII was the ones at Leyte Gulf. This action opened all avenues toward Japan by saving our committed forces which, if defeated, would have been disastrous.



Forty-one years ago on May 12,



I recently received a letter from the VA thru my Congressman regarding getting Coral Sea out on the VA list of ships exposed to defoliants during the Viet Nam war. As of now, the VA is refusing to place Coral Sea on the list of ships exposed to defoliants (Agent Orange, etc.) during the Viet Nam War. I'm disappointed in the response, but I'm not giving up. There are two bills in this Congress that address this problem. HR 969 (still in a House sub-committee with 296 co-sponsors) is the House version and S. 681 is the Senate version (still in a Senate Committee since May 2015). It is **imperative** that all Shipmates who served aboard Coral

Sea during the Viet Nam War contact their Member of Congress and US Senators demanding that they cosponsor and support this legislation. I've got a complete roster of the 114<sup>th</sup> Congress. Contact me now if you need to get your Member of Congress or US Senators contact info. Do not send letters by US Mail. All US Mail going to Congress gets screened and may take months for it to get delivered. Contact them with a phone call or e-mail. They do tract how their constituents feel on such matters. The squeaking wheel gets the grease. We need to start squeaking!!!
