SA man may be deported from US

SAN FRANCISCO, Thursday — A
young Adelaide man who told authorities he stowed away in the US aircraft
carrier Corol Sea in May — disguised
as an American sailor — is facing deportation from the US.

He is Mr. Thevor Bennett, 18, whose
mother, Mrs. G. B. Bennett, lives at College
road, Kent Town.

"Tve seen all of California I want to." he
told Lt. E. Volpe, of the Alameda County Sheriff's Office when he turned himself in on
Tuesday night.

Mr. Bennett said he made friends with some
American sailors when the USS Coral Sea
stopped in Perth in May, boarded the carrier
in an American uniform and kept out of sight
of officers during the month-long voyage to
the Alameda naval agit station.

held in San Francisco pending deportation.

At home at KENT TOWN last night Mrs.
Bennett said her daughter, Susan, 16, had
heard a radio news item yesterday that 'a boy
had been held in San Francisco pending deportation."

He had not been living at home and she
had known nothing of her son's escapade until
she received the letter from him in September.

"I was so surprised when I read the address on the envelope, but when I opened it I
was worried," she said.

"My friends and I thought it was stupid."

Mrs. Bennett said her son had asked her
for money and a passport.

She had written to him that nobody could
buy a passport and had asked him to give
himself up.

I really had a good time." After making friends with some "American sailors," he said he boarded the carrier in a Navy uniform and stayed out of sight for the month-long transit back to the US. Upon arrival, Bennett explained how he waited for wives, friends and girl friends to come aboard, then

walked off in civvies without raising

any eyebrows.

He spent the next five months touring California without a passport or visa, finally running out of money. His lack of funds led to his decision to give himself up to police two days before Christmas 1975.

While in prison, a naval intelligence officer visited to take his statement. His return trip to Australia was

again courtesy of the US Government—this time as a State Dept. deportee—traveling on a Pan Am jumbo jet and enjoying first-class accommodations most of the way!

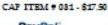
