When it came time for Captain Peck to leave the ship the Chief's decided to have a going away dinner for him at the Chief's Club on the base at Alameda. We all knew that he had been selected for Admiral, so we bought his first hat as a going away present.

The dinner was very cordial, pleasant, and lighthearted. At the end of the evening everybody lined up to say goodbye to the captain. As they went through the line there were the usual comments about what a pleasure it was to serve under him, and best wishes for the future. When it became my turn, I walked up to the captain, held out my hand, and with a smile said, "Goodbye you old bastard." It became deathly silent. 
