The museum is centered around the aircraft carrier Midway, which


houses an extensive collection of aircraft, many of which were built in Southern California.

A Brief History of USS Midway (CV-41)

USS Midway (CV-41), the lead ship of her class, has a rich history in the United States Navy. Here are some key points about this remarkable aircraft carrier:

- Midway was commissioned eight days after the end of World War II in September 1945.
- She was the largest warship in the world until 1955.
- Notably, Midway was the first U.S. aircraft carrier too big to transit the Panama Canal.
- Her initial homeport was Norfolk, and she served in the Atlantic Fleet for her first eight years of service.

In 1946, Midway participated in Operation Frostbite, testing cold-water operations in the Arctic. A year later, she made history as the launch pad for a V-2 ballistic missile.

Service Highlights:

- Over her 47-year operational lifespan, Midway saw action in the Vietnam War.
- She served as the Persian Gulf flagship during Operation Desert Storm in 1991.
- Decommissioned in 1992, Midway found a new role as a museum ship at the USS Midway Museum in San Diego, California.

History of USS Midway...

Remarkably, Midway is the only remaining inactive U.S. aircraft carrier that is not an Essex-class carri-

er.

Technical Details:

Displacement: 45,000 tons at commissioning, 64,000 tons at decommissioning.

Length: 1,001 feet (305 meters).

Beam: 121 feet (37 meters) initially, expanded to 136 feet (41 meters) at the flight deck after modernization. Draft: 34.5 feet (10.5 meters).

Propulsion: 12 boilers, four Westinghouse geared steam turbines.



Speed: 33 knots (61 km/h; 38 mph).

Armament: Initially included 18×5 "/54 caliber Mark 16 guns, $84 \times Bofors 40$

mm guns, and 56 × Oerlikon 20 mm cannons. After refit, she had 2 8-cell Sea Sparrow launchers and 2 Phalanx CIWS systems.

Aircraft Carried: Theoretical capacity of 137, but carried 100 (1940s-50s) and 70 (Vietnam-retirement) aircraft.

Midway's legacy lives on as a testament to naval history, innovation and US Navy sea and air superiority.
